

**EXTRACT OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF
EDUCATION ADOPTING BOND RESOLUTION**

At a meeting of the Board of Education of the Scotia-Glenville Central School District,

**BOND RESOLUTION DATED JUNE 24, 2024 OF THE
BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SCOTIA-GLENVILLE
CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE
ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$329,000 AGGREGATE
PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF SERIAL GENERAL
OBLIGATION BONDS TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION
OF SCHOOL BUSES AT AN ESTIMATED MAXIMUM
COST OF \$329,000, LEVY OF TAX IN ANNUAL
INSTALLMENTS IN PAYMENT THEREOF, THE
EXPENDITURE OF SUCH SUM FOR SUCH PURPOSE, AND
DETERMINING OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION
THEREWITH.**

WHEREAS, the qualified voters of the Scotia-Glenville Central School District, New York
(the "District") at the annual District meeting of such voters duly held on the 21st day of May,
2024, duly approved a proposition authorizing the issuance of serial general obligation bonds in
an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$329,000 to finance the acquisition of three (3) 30-
passenger school buses, the expenditure of such sum for such purpose, and the levy of the
necessary tax therefor, to be levied upon the taxable property of the District and collected in annual
installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS BOARD OF EDUCATION AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The District shall acquire three (3) 30-passenger school buses at a maximum cost of \$329,000 (including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof), as more particularly described in Section 3 hereof, and as generally outlined to and considered by the voters of the District at the annual District meeting of May 21, 2024.

Section 2. The District is hereby authorized to issue its serial general obligation bonds (the “Bonds”) in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$329,000 pursuant to the Local Finance Law of New York, in order to finance the class of objects or purposes described herein.

Section 3. The class of objects or purposes to be financed pursuant to this Resolution (the “Purpose”) is the acquisition of three (3) 30-passenger school buses (including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof).

Section 4. It is hereby determined and declared that (a) the maximum cost of the Purpose, as estimated by the Board of Education, is \$329,000, (b) no money has heretofore been authorized to be applied to the payment of the cost of the Purpose, and (c) the District plans to finance the cost of the Purpose from State aid, and funds raised by the issuance of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes hereinafter referred to.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the Purpose is one of the class of objects or purposes described in Subdivision 29 of Paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of the Purpose is five (5) years.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the sale of the Bonds, including

renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer.

Section 7. The power to further authorize the issuance of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes and to prescribe the terms, form and contents of the Bonds (including the use of substantially level or declining annual debt service as provided by Section 21 of the Local Finance Law) and bond anticipation notes, including the consolidation with other issues, subject to the provisions of this Resolution and the Local Finance Law, and to sell and deliver the Bonds and bond anticipation notes, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education. The President of the Board of Education is hereby authorized to sign and the District Clerk is hereby authorized to attest any Bonds and bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this Resolution, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized to affix to such Bonds and bond anticipation notes the corporate seal of the District.

Section 8. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and bond anticipation notes as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall be levied annually on all taxable real property of the District, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 9. This Resolution shall constitute the declaration of the District's "official intent" to reimburse expenditures authorized by Section 1 with proceeds of the Bonds and notes, as required by United States Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 10. This Resolution, or a summary thereof, shall be published by the District Clerk together with a notice in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of said Local Finance

Law, and such publication shall be in each official newspaper of the District. The validity of the Bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of the Bonds may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this Resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or if said obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. The firm Barclay Damon LLP is hereby appointed as Bond Counsel to the School District in connection with the issuance of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein.

Section 12. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
